From the Rector's Desk:

Embracing our true purpose

The season of Lent in 2025 begins on Ash Wednesday, at a time when we find ourselves in the midst of divisions, conflicts, hate, struggles, discrimination, and economic challenges. We are now living in fear and uncertainty. We feel threatened and all this has negatively affected our social, spiritual and economic lives. What is God saying to us during this Lent season?

A story is told of two camels, a mother and her young calf, who were sitting under a tree enjoying the shade in a zoo.

The young camel, full of curiosity, turned to its mother and asked, "Mom, why do we have these big humps on our backs?"

The mother camel smiled and replied, "Our humps store fat, my dear, so we can survive long journeys across the desert without needing food.

The young camel thought for a moment and asked another question, "And why do you have such long legs and padded feet?"

The mother answered patiently, "Our long and wide feet help us walk on the hot soft desert sand without sinking."

The calf still curious asked, "Why do we have such thick eyelashes?"

The mother said, "Our thick eyelashes protect our eyes from the sand and the harsh sun in the desert."

After a moment of silence, the young camel looked around, puzzled, and finally asked, "Mom, if we all have these amazing things for surviving in the desert... what are we doing here in the zoo?"

This simple story is a powerful reminder that we are designed with a purpose. God has gifted us with talents, abilities and spiritual gifts meant to be used for His glory and to serve others.

The apostle Paul reminds us in Ephesians 2:10 that we are God's handiwork, uniquely crafted to accomplish the good works He prepared for us. Just like the camel was designed for the desert, we too have a divine purpose that aligns with God's plan.

God calling us not to get comfortable at the zoo, but to come out and seek forgiveness and reconciliation with one another as a way of renewal. To lament over the struggles we are going through, we will call on God in prayer and fasting to bring peace and justice. And finally, to hope in Christ as we begin our Lenten journey that culminates on Easter. Through this we will be able to embrace our true purpose.
